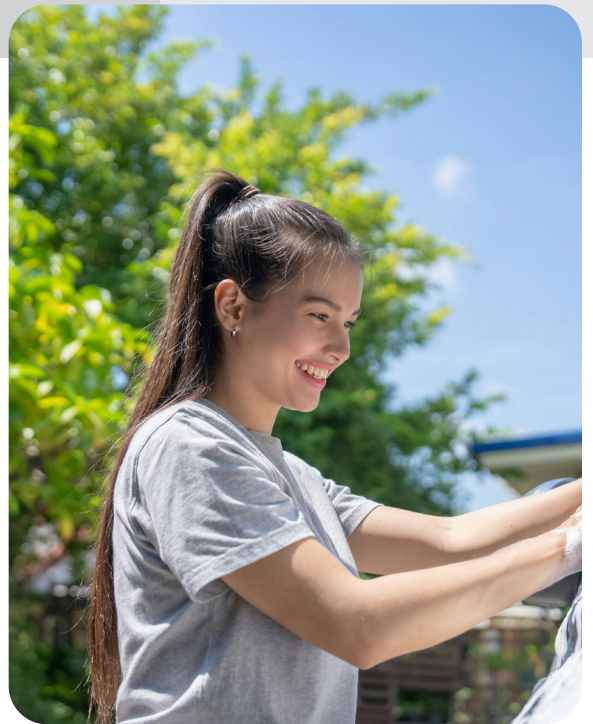

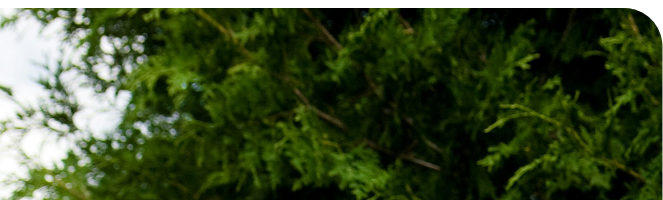

However, the ratio does not have to be perfect. Don't be afraid to add more water if you want to get the suds back up 2–3 times during your wash. If you use enough soap concentrate, it will foam right back up with more water.

Shammies for Extra Absorbency: If you prefer a more traditional drying method, shammies are a great option. They are extremely absorbent and can soak up large amounts of water without soaking through. Plus, they're gentle enough to avoid any abrasions. Just make sure your chamois is clean before you use it!



Squeegies and Water Blades can be a great tool for getting the majority of water off the surface of your car and windows before drying using a cloth. Another time-saving hack is to use an electric leaf blower to get most of the drying done.

DRYING IN THE RIGHT ORDER

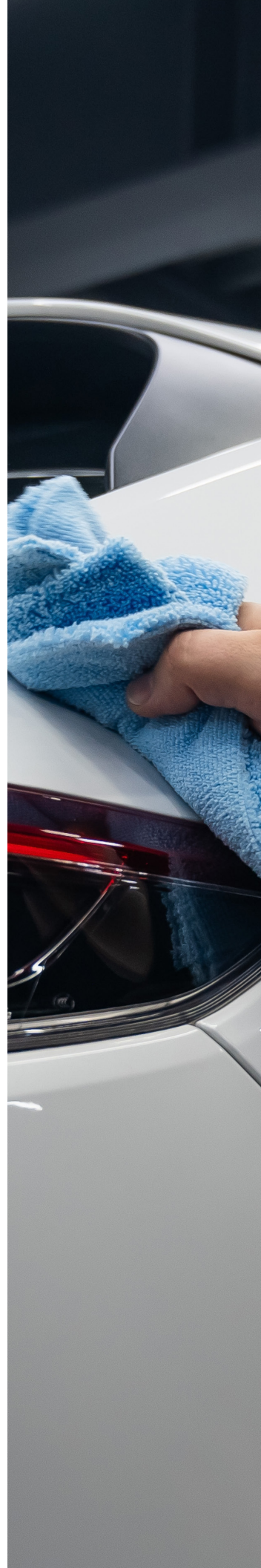

Wheel Wells and Underneath: Don't forget to dry your tires and the inner wheel wells. Water trapped in these areas can cause rust and dirt buildup over time.

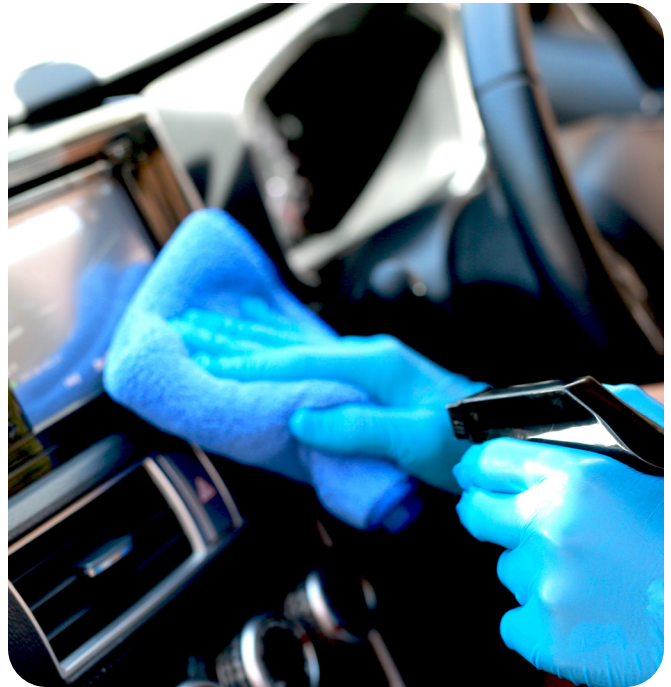

Unlike traditional air fresheners that just mask odors, an odor neutralizer breaks down the molecules causing the bad smells, leaving behind a fresh and clean scent.

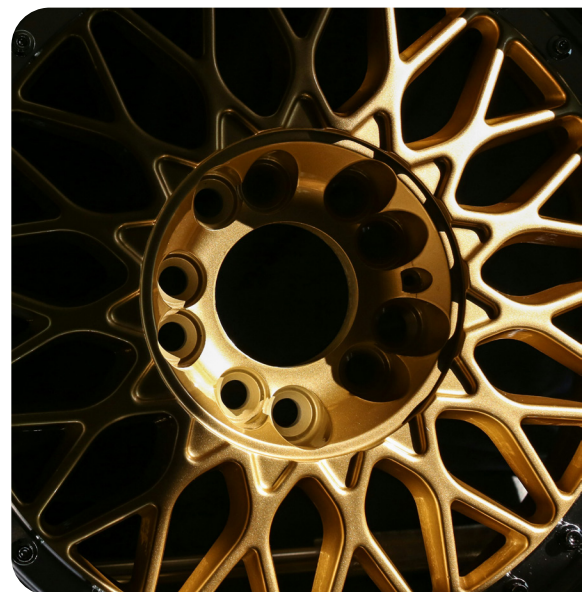
SPRAY VS. WIPE-ON TIRE SHINE
